### 41 VAUST BRAUGASTSTATTE

Pestalozzistr. 8 Charlottenburg ③ +49 (0)30 5459 9160 www.vaust-berlin.de Vaust is one of the few fancy 100 percent vegan restaurants in Berlin. The service is friendly and the cuisine could be classified as 'vegan German fine dining'. Portions are rather small so you still have some room for the very tasty chocolate cake. Another plus: they have self-brewed beer.

### 42 LUCKY LEEK

Kollwitzstrasse 54 Prenzlauer Berg ③ +49 (0)30 6640 8710 www.lucky-leek.com Here's one of the first vegan restaurants that took vegan food to another level. It's located right between the Kollwitz-platz and the famous Water Tower and offers a superb dining experience. It's a little on the expensive side for Berlin but Josita Hartanto's vegan dishes are worth it – think pear and chilli risotto with tandoori cabbage and nori tempeh rolls. Nice outside terrace.

### **43 KOPPS**

Linienstrasse 94 Mitte ① +49 (0)30 4320 9775 www.kopps-berlin.de Kopps has been around since 2011 and CNN voted it one of the best vegan restaurants in the world. The restaurant emphasises quality, regional produce sourced from small farmers in Brandenburg. They also serve an excellent brunch in the weekends. Lots of good coffee bars and ice-cream parlours in the neighbourhood.

### 44 **SOY**

Rosa-Luxemburg-Strasse 30 Mitte ① +49 (0)30 2340 5890 www.sov-berlin.com Very tasty glutamate-free dishes at very reasonable prices: that's what you can expect at this beautiful restaurant near the Babylon cinema. The restaurant was designed with the help of a fengshui master and has a nice view on the Volksbühne and an outside terrace.

### 45 RAWTASTIC

Danzigerstrasse 16 Prenzlauer Berg ③ +49 (0)172 4391 287 www.rawtastic.de If you're a fan of the raw food movement, don't miss this restaurant in the heart of Prenzlauer Berg. The food here is never heated over 42°C because then the enzyme activity and nutrient levels begin to diminish. They serve breakfast, lunch and dinner and also make 100 percent cold pressed juices. Want to try this at home? Take one of their cooking lessons.

# The 5 most ECCENTRIC BARS

### 111 **BRYK**

Rykestrasse 18 Prenzlauer Berg ③ +49 (0)30 3810 0165 www.bryk-bar.com Here's one of the few non-smoking bars in Berlin. It has a sunny terrace and the bar itself is a mixture of different styles: antique, design, vintage and industrial. Drinks here are among the best in the city. Bryk offers also catering, cocktail workshops, and spirits seminars. Ring the bell or you won't get in.

### 112 BAUMHAUS BAR

Falckensteinstrasse 48 Kreuzberg ② +49 (0)30 2391 9994 This tree house bar serves baked goods by day and booze by night. The view on the yellow U1 trains is amazing. But if you don't like it, no problem: there are a million of other bars, restaurants and clubs around the corner to choose from.

### 113 WÜRGEENGEL BAR

Dresdener Str. 122 Kreuzberg ② +49 (0)30 6155 560 www.wuergeengel.de This bar got its name from the Luis Bunuel movie *The Exterminating Angel*. In the film, the bar's visitors are caught under the angel's mysterious spell. They experience a force that doesn't allow them to move anymore. This bar aspires to have this same effect. We tried it. And it worked.


### 114 KLO BAR

No kidding, the loo, that's the theme here. A very popular one apparently, and not only with students. You sit on an actual toilet while you are sipping a beer and stirring it with a small toilet brush. Really.

### 115 CAFÉ STRAUSS

It's the perfect place for an afternoon tea or coffee (which is excellent by the way) with a long-forgotten friend.





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# The 5 best CONTEMPORARY DESIGN shops

### 246 GEYERSBACH

Kopenhagener Str. 17 Prenzlauer Berg ③ +49 (0)176 6416 7571 www.geyersbach.com This furniture shop takes upcycling and recycling to another level. Old doors are turned into lockers, old floors into tables. It's all very beautiful, ecological, one-of-a-kind and soulful. Ulf and Katia Geyersbach have a passion for old pinewood that they mainly salvage from old abandoned buildings.

### 247 **S7-STORE**

Max-Beer-Strasse 25 Mitte ① +49 (0)30 3087 2074 www.siehensachen.com Siebensachen is the baby of Adam+ Harborth. Both these product designers design games, musical boxes and other items under their own names, but they also work for various international brands. Their designs are timeless with a twist, and made out of carefully selected materials.

### 248 HALLESCHES HAUS

Tempelhofer Ufer 1 Kreuzberg ② +49 (0)176 8413 8777 www.hallescheshaus.com Everything in this former post office is selected with the greatest care and style. One of the owners, Oliver, makes closed jar mini-gardens that add even more character to the space. The spacey and airy restaurant serves an excellent lunch that changes every day. And then there's the lovely inside courtyard.



## The 5 most astonishing STREET ART WORKS

### 316 RAW GELÄNDE

Along Revalerstrasse Friedrichshain ④ This old train repair centre is now one of the last subcultural compounds in central Berlin. This graffiti-filled space also harbours clubs, bars, a swimming pool club, an indoor skate park, a flea market and a bunker-turned-climbing-wall.

#### 317 KREUZBERG

Entire neighbourhood Kreuzberg ② Kreuzberg was always at the centre of Berlin's alternative scene, which explains why there is a lot of politically motivated street art here. The highlights of this area are the firewalls with huge murals on them. *Take the Spaceman*, for example: it's one of the largest stencils in the world, tagged by the French artist Victor Ash.

### 318 HAUS SCHWARZEN-BERG

Rosenthalerstr. 39 Mitte ① +49 (0)30 3087 2573 www.hausschwarzenberg.org The whole of Haus Schwarzenberg and its courtyard manages to maintain its postwar state. It houses shops, a club, an independent cinema and two museums. What triggers the interest of street art enthusiasts are the stunning works of famous street artists like D Screet, Jimmy C or El Bocho.

### 319 TAGESZEITUNG (TAZ)

"Friede sei mit Dir" (May peace be with you) Rudi-Dutschke-Strasse 23 Kreuzberg ② Kai Diekmann, the right-wing editor of *Bild Zeitung*, sued the leftist TAZ for libel after it 'reported' in its satire column that Diekmann had a penis enlargement surgery, "but the operation went badly and resulted in castration". Diekmann lost and TAZ installed a sculpture of Diekmann, with a six-metre-long penis, on the side of their building, which is across the street from Bild's building.

#### 320 EAST SIDE GALLERY

Mühlenstrasse Friedrichshain ④ After the Wall came down, the East Side Gallery was created by more than 150 artists that used this section of the Wall as their canvas. Very famous is the *Kiss of Death*, showing Soviet premier Brezhnev and GDR leader Honecker in an intimate embrace.



### 5 important CULTURAL FESTIVALS

### **391 BERLINALE**

www.berlinale.de FEBRUARY The Berlinale must be Berlin's most famous festival. It's one of the most important dates for the international film industry: more than 335.000 tickets are sold every year, and there are more than 20.000 professional visitors from 122 countries. That's a lot of glitter and glamour for 'poor but sexy' Berlin. Buy your tickets early!

### 392 TANZ IM AUGUST/ DANCE IN AUGUST

+49 (0)30 2590 0427 www.tanzimaugust.de AUGUST/SEPTEMBER Germany's biggest festival for contemporary dance began as an avant-garde and experimental festival. During later years, it moved on to being about more than niche art, and it now stands for great guest performances. The festival (presented by HAU, see secret 388) explores the link between visual art and movement.

### 393 **48 STUNDEN** NEUKÖLLN

Neukölln www.48-stundenneukoelln.de END OF JUNE Two days of art in Berlin's hippest district. The festival is a joint initiative involving artists, spectators and other residents. The organisers try to involve all segments of the local population, regardless of age, ethnic background or social standing. Bringing art closer to the people, it had been tried before, but 48 Stunden Neukölln really seems to succeed in its mission.

### 394 BERLIN BIENNALE FOR CONTEMPORARY ART

blog.berlinbiennale.de EVERY EVEN YEAR ON DIFFERENT LOCATIONS The Berlin Biennale has established itself as an 'open space' that experiments with, identifies and critically examines the latest trends in the world of art. This 'art lab' has a strong focus on the post-contemporary condition. Don't expect too many established names. The latest editions are proving to be a polarising affair.

### 395 INTERNATIONALES LITERATURFESTIVAL BERLIN

### 431 PROPELLER ISLAND CITY LODGE

### **432 NHOW BERLIN**

German artist Lars Stroschen created all rooms and all objects in this extraordinary place. Some rooms are pretty extreme, others a lot more normal, so choose wisely. But you may rest assured that literally everything in this hotel is unique.

This huge hotel was built near the Universal building on the so-called Media Spree – on this bank of the Spree river several media-players, like MTV, have their offices. Nhow attracts a lot of musicians, not only because of the radical design of the hotel by architect Karim Rashid but also because of the in-house concerts and fashion shows. All 304 rooms have stunning views.

### **433 OSTEL HOTEL BERLIN**

Wriezener Karree 5 Friedrichshain ④ www.ostel.eu +49 (0)30 2576 8660 This design hotel is located near the famous East Side Gallery and the huge Mercedes Benz World venue and takes you back to the time of the GDR (German Democratic Republic). Everything here reminds you of those days when the Soviets called the shots in East Berlin, from the building – an authentic *Plattenbau* (see secret 429) – to the interior design and vintage memorabilia. Nostalgia turned Ostalgia or GDR-chic.

### **434 MODERN BOAT**

### 435 HOTEL-PENSION FUNK

Fasanenstrasse 69 Charlottenburg ③ +49 (0)30 8827 193 www.hotel-pension funk.de This private (boat) house lies in a little working harbour on the river Spree, namely in Rummelsburg, and offers a truly wonderful view on the water. It's only 10 minutes by car or tram to the funky district of Friedrichshain. The building features modern design, large windows and a fireplace.

Built in 1895, this house reached fame through its prominent inhabitant, the world famous actress of silent movies Asta Nielsen. The hotel is pretty authentic and the detailed Art Nouveau windows and beautiful ceilings are well preserved. Ideal if you like small, well priced hotels with a lot of character.

### **BEAUTIFUL LAKES**

### around Berlin

### 451 GROSS GLIENICKER SEE

Potsdam

This lake is a little bit further away from the city but it's absolutely worth the trip, not only because of the extremely clear water, but also because of the two little green islands. There are two sandy beaches and there's a bus stop near the lake.

### **452 SCHLACHTENSEE**

Steglitz-Zehlendorf

This is one of the most beautiful lakes that public transportation will ever take you to. The Schlachtensee, on the border of the Grünewald, is rated Berlin's cleanest lake. It's a pristine spot for swimming as well as an ideal hiking area. Go to the Fischer Hütte for a cold postswim beer.

### 453 MÜGGELSEE

Treptow-Köpenick ⑤ www.spreearche.de

Berlin's largest lake, east of Köpenick, is fed by the Spree. The lower section of the lake – the Kleiner Müggelsee – is perfect for swimming and a chill-out afternoon. The big Müggelsee is perfect for a boat trip – there are boats for rent. A perfect place for dinner is the Spreearche, a log-house that you can only reach by mini-ferry.

### **454 SACROWER SEE**

Potsdam

This less frequented but clean and beautiful lake is a bit more difficult to reach. There's only one real beach at the lake, next to the restaurant Landleben Potsdam.

### 455 LIETZENSEE

The large Lietzensee can get pretty crowded because of its proximity to the city, but still it's absolutely worth a visit. The Parkhaus Lietzensee is stunning and sells ice cream on sunny afternoons.
