Abnegation

The denial and rejection of a doctrine or belief; the act of not allowing yourself to have something, especially something you like or want.

Acronym

Is an abbreviation consisting of the first letters of each word in the name of something, pronounced as a word (*AIDS* is an acronym for *Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome*; *NATO* is an acronym for *North Atlantic Treaty Organization*).

Accustomed

Familiar with something; usual (for example: *She quickly became accustomed to new job*).

Agenda

Is a list of things to be discussed or done at a meeting or business event (for example: *Are you sure we can cover everything on today's agenda in 2 hours?*).

Agglomeration

Means a large group of many different things collected or brought together.

Agile

When someone or something is agile, it can deal with changes quickly and successfully. An agile company is able to adapt quickly and easily adapt to all changes and complexities.

Algorithm

Is a procedure or formula for solving a problem, based on conducting a sequence of specified actions.

Alleviate

Means to make something easier to deal with or endure.

Allusion

Is a figure of speech that makes a reference to a place, person, or event. This can be real or imaginary and may refer to anything, including fiction, folklore, historical events, or religious manuscripts (for example: *When she lost her job, she acted like a Scrooge, and*
