Curaçao's economy relies on diverse economic activities, which include tourism, the international financial services sector, trade and industry. Located just 35 miles off the coast of Venezuela, the Port of Willemstad is among the region's most developed and best-organized ports. Because of the favorable location of the natural harbour, Curaçao's harbour evolved from a few simple quays to a multi-faceted maritime service center, housing several transnational companies including region's largest dry dock company, a free trade zone, state-of-the-art mega cruise facilities and one of the largest crude oil refinery and oil transshipment centers in the region, currently operated by Petróleos de Venezuela S.A. (PDVSA).

In 1914 oil was discovered at the Lake of Maracaibo in Venezuela. The Royal Shell Oil Company choose Curaçao, mostly because of its broad and deep natural harbour, as its base and built a refinery between 1918 and 1924 in Schottegat. Oil became the engine of Curaçao's economy. During the Second World War, the Curaçao oil industry flourished as never before as the Allied forces in North Africa depended entirely on fuel which the refineries of Curaçao and Aruba supplied. Both islands became military targets with the result that the Royal Dutch Navy and the military to be placed under command of the Americans and American troops were stationed on Curaçao. Since 1950, the defense of the Antilles has entirely been back in the hands of the Royal Dutch Navy.

Harbour Tour

On Wednesdays and Saturdays a guided harbour tour is available. Through the Curaçao Maritime Museum. With a 'waterfall' you will sail through one of the oldest and busiest harbours in the Caribbean. The tour starts at 2 PM and ends back at the Curaçao Maritime Museum. The museum exhibits the maritime history of Curaçao.
